2.8 Examination/ Evaluation Reforms initiated by the Institution.

To facilitate the conducting of examination and to provide sufficient seating arrangement, new rooms were constructed which helped in both class room teaching and examination seating plan. Sufficient furniture is available in these rooms. The height of four walls of the college was increased so that the unwanted elements may not enter and disturb the smooth holding of exams. Security personnel's have been employed to check the entry of outsiders. These security persons assisted by the senior faculty members check the students at entry gate and only the students who

have roll no slips and admit card of examination are allowed to enter. They too are thoroughly checked so that they may not carry with them any cheating material. Students are not permitted to carry mobile phones, pager and other objectionable material with them in the examination centre. About 40 CCTV Cameras have been installed to keep an eye on all the activities going on in the college.

6.3.1 <u>Curriculum Development</u>

Although there is no direct involvement of the college in the development of curriculum, but our staff members try to know the views of the students about curriculum through questionnaires. The suggestion or problems of the students regarding the syllabus are discussed by the members of the concerned departments and sometimes they are mailed to the Board of studies of M.D. University Rohtak directly and sometimes our faculty members, who are invited by the Board of studies, present these worthwhile suggestions, changes, deletion or addition in the meetings.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Class room lectures, Subject Practicals, EDUSAT Lecture System, PPT, OHP, Smart Board, LED PROJECTOR, Interactive boards, Language Labs, Science Models, Charts, Slides, Live Examples, Specimens, Field Visit, Zoological Park, visits to Financial Initiations like Bank LIC etc.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Examinations are conducted semester wise following the rules and norms of the M.D. University, Rohtak. Question papers and answer books are provided by the University and invigilating staff is appointed by the university. Answer books are evaluated at the nodal centers fixed by the University. The University declares the results and issues the certificates accordingly.

Internal Assessment: The college sends Internal Assessment awards of the students of all classes to the University on the basis of class tests, assignments and attendance in the class.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The college authorities encourage the faculty members to carry out research by writing research paper, attending seminars/ workshop/conferences sending proposals for National and International seminars and projects. They are liberal enough to provide the required help.

The students are encouraged to develop research aptitude by preparing models/ working models their innovative ideas are invited and included in the college magazine and contest also. Science exhibition is annual feature. The selected models are sent to District Level, University Level & State Level competitions.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

The college has good library consisting of subject books, reference books, generals, periodicals such as a large number of Newspaper and magazines. It has separate seating arrangement for staff and students, where they can study in the peaceful and calm environment. The librarian and assisting staff is very cooperative and helpful.

College has its own website (www.ggdsdcollegepalwal.in.) by which any information can be obtained such as appointment, latest notifications, details of faculties and their departments. Internet facility has been provided in the college office, library and most of the departments. The work of the office of the college is fully computerized particularly financial transactions. Computer labs are also beneficiaries of Internet facilities.

Development fund collected from students annual fees and assistance from the Government in the form of grant is used for this purpose. For the construction of the building, the building committee consisting of some members of Management, Principal and faculty members both teaching and non-teaching has been formed. Science Fund and UGC Funds are used for purchasing the instruments and their maintenance. Purchase committee consisting of faculty members performs this task by inviting quotations and bids.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

Advisory committee and IQAC of the college decides the number of seats for admission in various faculties i.e. Arts, Science and Commerce. Admission committees are constituted for various classes which recommend the admission of the students strictly according to their merit following the norms/rules of M.D. University, Rohtak. Principal is fully authorized to keep an eye on all the activities of the staff and take action accordingly. Appointments and salary for the staff are made as per the UGC and state Government norms.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

The faculty members of teaching and non-teaching are appointed according to the norms and rules of UGC/Director General Higher Education (Haryana) & M.D. University Rohtak. The qualifications and salary conditions / norms are as per Haryana Government rules.

6.3.8 <u>Industry Interaction / Collaboration</u>

The nearby industries are contacted and visited so that the students may be benefited by the job opportunities and obtain practical knowledge about their functioning. The institution invites the officers of Employment Exchange, Palwal Haryana to enlighten and help our students in obtaining job they also provide knowledge and help for further studies.

6.3.9 Admission of Students

In the admission of the students the institution follows the rules or norms of M.D. University Rohtak. The students of entry level class i.e. Ist year classes of UG and PG courses have to submit their admission forms by the fixed date. Then these forms are scrutinized by the staff members and merit list is prepared. Only eligible

students are admitted charging the same fees as fixed by the University/Government rules. The admission seats are reserved for SC/BC/Physically Challenged students and they get rebate in the price of prospectus also. Fee concession is given to meritorious students, sportspersons and students of reserve categories. The Girl students are exempted from tuition fees.

Strength: We can feel proud to say that it was the oldest college established between Delhi and Agra soon after the independence i.e. 1955 to cater the demand of Science Stream as well as Arts Stream at its initial stage. Later on in 1982 the commerce stream was also introduced. The college can brag that it has got well qualified teaching faculty and well equipped labs. The college started professional courses like BCA & BBA long time back in 1998. It has been sprawling with the

Chemistry, Mathematics, Botany and Commerce. It was a long pending demand in south Haryana to start M.Sc. classes and the same were started in August 2008.

The college authorities are always eager to support faculty members to attend/participate/ organized any programme like seminar, refresher, orientation courses or pursue research activities to enhance and refresh their knowledge.

The students are encouraged to participate, organize and attend academic, cultural, sports and any other extension activity, be it at college level, inter-college level, university level or state / national level. The College Authorities liberal in this regard.

We also have huge open area to construct new building/infrastructure.

Weakness: The majority of the students hail from rural areas hence they give priority to family supporting activities like harvesting, cattle rearing etc. and devote lesser time to their studies and therefore, the results of these students are comparatively poor.

Opportunities: - We intend to start new courses, engage more faculty members and provide more infrastructure if the Government is generous enough in this field.

Challenges: - We intend to improve the performance of our students so that they may be better prepared for competition with the urban students.

8. Plans of institution for next year
